SOLAR ECLIPSE

From Nasa.gov. On Monday, August 21, 2017, all of North America will be treated to an eclipse of the sun. Anyone within the path of totality can see one of nature's most awe-inspiring sights - a total solar eclipse. This path, where the moon will completely cover the sun and the sun's tenuous atmosphere - the corona - can be seen, will stretch from Lincoln Beach, Oregon to Charleston, South Carolina. Observers outside this path will still see a partial solar eclipse where the moon covers part of the sun's disk.



What is It?

This celestial event is a solar eclipse in which the moon passes between the sun and Earth and blocks all or part of the sun for up to about three hours, from beginning to end, as viewed from a given location. For this eclipse, the longest period when the moon completely blocks the sun from any given location along the path will be about two minutes and 40 seconds. The last time the contiguous U.S. saw a total eclipse was in 1979

How Can You See It?

You **NEVER** want to look directly at the sun without appropriate protection. Looking directly at the sun could severely hurt your eyes. However, there are many ways to safely view an eclipse of the sun including direct viewing (which requires some type of filtering device such as special glasses) and indirect viewing (where you project an image of the sun onto a screen). Both methods should produce clear images of the partial phase of an eclipse.

Summer is here! Time for barbecues, pool parties, and air conditioning (heavy on the air conditioning).

Also, rains will fall and the grass and weeds will grow as though they are on steroids. So before you head out to cut the lawn or work in the garden here are some safety precautions.

- *Always wear sunscreen* This can not be stressed enough. If you are going outdoors, please put on sunscreen of at least SPF 30.
- *Dress appropriately* Wear light-colored, light-weight, loose fitting clothing.
- Avoid strenuous activity. If you have to work in the yard, try to work in the mornings and evenings, when the sun is not so harsh.
- **Drink lots of fluids** Preferably water

Overexposure to the heat can lead to a variety of serious health problems.

Heat exhaustion is a warning that your body cannot cool itself. Symptoms include thirst, dizziness, weakness, poor coordination, nausea and sweating. Body temperature stays normal, but the skin feels cold and clammy and pulse can be normal or raised. If this is the case, rest in a cool place, drink plenty of fluids and take a cool shower or sponge bath. This condition can turn into heatstroke, so if you do not feel better quickly, seek medical care right away.

- Only two people actually signed the Declaration of Independence on July 4: John Hancock and Charles Thomson, secretary of Congress. Most of the others signed on August 2.
- 56 people signed the Declaration of Independence
- John Adams believed that July 2nd was the correct date on which to celebrate the birth of American independence, and would reportedly turn down invitations to appear at July 4th events in protest.
