We suggest never trusting anyone that calls, emails or comes up to you asking for donations. The Federal Trade Commission also has a few suggestions that will help you get your money to those that need it,

- 1) Donate to charities you know and trust and that have a proven
- 2) Avoid charities that seem to have sprung up overnight in connection with current events. Some are scams. And even if they mean well, charities formed quickly may not have the infrastructure
- 3) Check out the charity with the Better Business Bureau's (BBB) Wise Giving Alliance, Charity Navigator, Charity Watch, or GuideStar. These organizations provide lists of charities they have screened that are raising funds for specific causes, like Hurricane Harvey or Irma
- 4) Don't assume that charity messages posted on social media are legitimate. Research the organization yourself online. Search the
- 5) Designate the disaster. Charities may give the option to designate your giving to a specific relief effort. That way, you can ensure your funds are going to help hurricane victims, rather than a general fund.
- 7) When texting to donate, confirm the number with the source before you donate. The charge will show up on your mobile phone bill,
- 8) Find out if the charity or fundraiser must be registered in your state by contacting the National Association of State Charity Officials.



Halloween Safety Tips for Trick or Treating
