In Pinellas County, it is unlawful to feed wildlife. Feeding can increase the danger of the spread of disease and draws in larger predators. Wild animals fed by humans may quickly lose their natural fear and possibly attack without provocation. Wildlife habituated to humans feeding them often have to be destroyed because of the danger they pose to neighborhood pets and residents.

- Do not leave pet food out at night.
- Do not leave garage doors, pet doors or unscreened windows open at night.
- Do pick up fruit that has fallen from trees.
- Do cover garbage cans at night.
