

# **ABOUT DEED RESTRICTIONS**

DEED RESTRICTIONS PROTECT ALL OAKLEAF VILLAGE RESIDENTS!

Since its inception, Oakleaf Village has been a DEED RESTRICTED COMMUNITY. The Deed restrictions are a legal and binding attachment to the land on each and every lot in Oakleaf, The purpose of deed restrictions is to maintain the quality and consistency, along with the aesthetic and financial value of the entire subdivision.

The officers and Board of Directors of the Oakleaf Village Homeowners' Association are elected annually and are governed by a set of bylaws that charge them with the authority to ensure compliance with these deed restrictions.

When we receive a complaint of a deed restriction violation, the OVHA Compliance Committee checks it out and if it is a deed restriction violation, a letter is sent to the offending resident. The letter states the violation and asks the resident to correct the violation. Most residents are very cooperative and immediately make the correction. If the correction is not made within a reasonable amount of time a second letter will be sent asking the resident to correct the violation. If there still is no resolution the next step could be legal action.

This usually is not necessary as most residents are eager to comply with the deed restrictions in order to maintain their property value.

# **A LITTLE HISTORY**

Tarpon Springs, the oldest incorporated city in Pinellas county

On February 12, 1887, Tarpon Springs became the first incorporated city in what is now Pinellas County. Less than a year later on January 13, 1888, the Orange Belt Railway, the first railroad line to be built in what is now Pinellas County, arrived in the city. During this time the area was developed as a wintering spot for wealthy northerners.

# **MEMORIAL DAY**

Memorial Day is an American holiday, observed on the last Monday of May, honoring the men and women who died while serving in the U.S. military. Memorial Day 2022 will occur on Monday, May 30.

#### **History of Memorial Day**

Memorial Day, as Decoration Day gradually came to be known, originally honored only those lost while fighting in the Civil War. But during World War I the United States found itself embroiled in another major conflict, and the holiday evolved to commemorate American military personnel who died in all wars, including World War II, The Vietnam War, The Korean War and the wars in Iraq and Afghanistan.

For decades, Memorial Day continued to be observed on May 30, the date General Logan had selected for the first Decoration Day. But in 1968, Congress passed the Uniform Monday Holiday Act, which established Memorial Day as the last Monday in May in order to create a three-day weekend for federal employees. The change went into effect in 1971. The same law also declared Memorial Day a federal holiday.
