PINELLAS COUNTY LEASH LAWS



There has been several complaints about dogs not on a leash, especially in the park on Timber Lane. Please keep in mind that ALL dogs and cats, yes this even applies to our feline overloads, must be kept on a leash when not on the private property of the owner.

This is not a deed restriction, this is Pinellas County law.

Chapter 14: Sec. 14-63 Dogs or cats at large.

(a) No dog or cat shall run at large within the county, as defined under this article. Any person who possesses,

harbors, keeps, or has control or custody of any dog or cat which is running at large shall be in violation of this article, regardless of the knowledge, intent or culpability of the owner.

At-large means any dog or cat on the owner’s premises which is not within the unobstructed sight and in the control of the owner, or any dog or cat not confined by sufficient means to assure that it is maintained on the property of the owner; or any dog or cat off the owner’s premises which is not controlled by an adequate leash or tether, or otherwise under the owner’s physical control, as defined in this section.

So if you are walking your dog remember you must have them on a leash.

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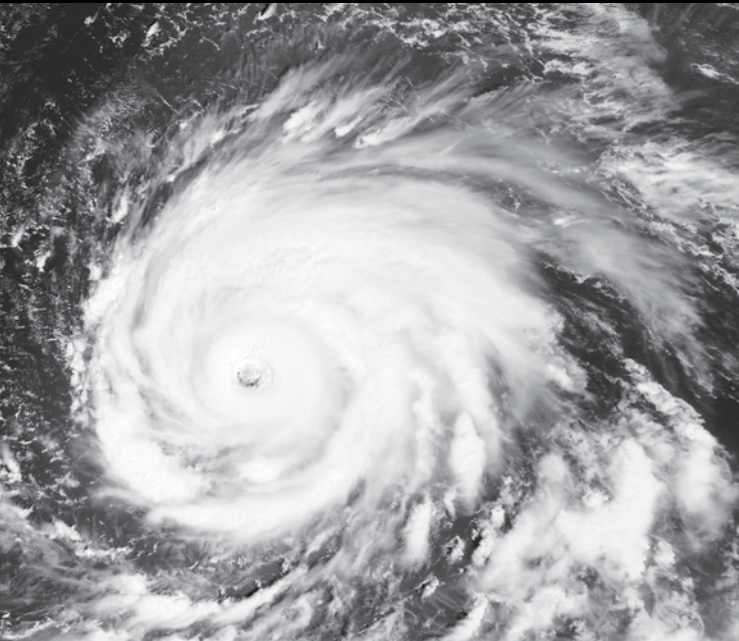

Know Your Hurricane Evacuation Zone

Pinellas County has updated its hurricane evacuation zones. The evacuation zones are determined based on the potential for storm surge to flood a neighborhood.

Sea level rise is steadily making storm surges worse. Even minor hurricanes can cause flooding and forecasters have predicted a higher than average hurricane season this year.

That is why, when preparing for hurricane season, you need to know your evacuation zone. If a hurricane is bearing down on us, the county will order residents to evacuate by zone.

Evacuation levels range from Zone A (the highest risk) to Zone E.

Homes in Oakleaf Village fall into several different evacuation zones. There are also homes within Oakleaf that are in a non-evacuation zone. To check your evacuation zone, go to storm.pinellascounty.org or call 727-453-3150.
