IN THE WORKS (Fall Festival)


The HOA board is currently working on organizing a Fall Festival. It has been a few years since we have done this and are looking forward to this family event. There will be food, games, and music.

LOCAL WILDLIFE

The Blue Jay



Blue Jays, known for their striking blue plumage and (harsh raucous and loud) calls, are a common sight in Florida. These intelligent birds are highly adaptable and can be found in a variety of habitats, including parks. forests. residential and areas. They are

particularly fond of oak trees, as these provide both food and shelter.

Backyard Tips: Blue Jays are attracted to bird feeders, where they will eagerly consume some of their favorite foods such as acorns, sunflower seeds, safflower, cracked corn, peanuts, millet, and suet.

Blue Jays, being omnivorous, also eat small insects, snails, bird eggs, small rodents, and frogs.

Nesting: Nest site is in tree, 8'+ above ground. It is a bulky open cup made of twigs, grass, weeds, bark strips, moss, sometimes held together with mud. Nest is lined with rootlets and other fine materials, often decorated with paper, rags, string, or other debris.

This years food drive raised 175lbs of food for the Tarpon Springs Shepard's Center, our best collection in recent years. A big thank you to all that donated.




ALLIGATOR MATING SEASON

Gator mating season runs from April to June (or there about) and during this time you should take some precautions.
